Teaching and Learning Update

As a school we have worked very hard over the last year, following our disappointing Ofsted result. Growth in pupil numbers has allowed us to move from 2 classes to 3, and allowed us to ensure that we always have 2 members of staff in Early Years. Both staff and governors have accessed a range of training opportunities, and we have had support from both the Local Authority and the Diocese in our journey to put the school back on a solid foundation. The governing body and I now feel that the school is moving forward in a very positive manner, with happy, safe children who are all engaged in their learning, and access it through a range of means. We are, however, not going to rest on our laurels - there are still many things that we can do to help your children have a memorable and successful time at Embleton Primary School. We will continue to work hard to give your children the best opportunities and know that you will support us by doing your part ensuring that your children are well prepared for each day of learning.

School Funding

Many of you will be aware from the media that school funding is, as with many public services, incredibly tight. As a school we are given a set amount of money per child that attends. Unsurprisingly, the amount that we get in has not gone up at the same rate as our costs and, as in every school, our staffing costs also come out of this single funding pot. It is a continual struggle to balance the books, whilst at the same time providing your children with the quality of education they deserve. This is why I am incredibly grateful to the PFA for all the work they do fundraising, and why am incredibly thankful to all of you who support PFA events. The bag-pack and Christmas Fair alone raised over £1000, which will be spent on a variety of things we need to maintain our Beach School in the long term - for example hi-vis jackets, emergency shelter, and trolley.

PE - Years 1 to 5

This half term Years 1 to 5 will go to Willowburn each week on **Thursday** for bouldering or freestyle gymnastics. Please ensure that <u>children wear school uniform but bring in PE kits and a water bottle on a Thursday.</u>

PE - Year 6

This half term Year 6 will do yoga on a **Wednesday**. Please ensure that children <u>wear school</u> <u>uniform but bring in PE kits and a water bottle</u> on a Wednesday.

Beach School

We will be continuing to attend Beach School every Friday. Please ensure that children wear school PE kit to come to school. We will continue to monitor and assess the weather and conditions each week, and will adjust our sessions accordingly, whether that be by working in the dunes, going to a sheltered spot on the beach, going down slightly later, or coming back earlier. Assume that your child will ALWAYS be going and dress them accordingly. Please ensure coats are properly waterproof (not just shower proof), and that your child is wearing layers underneath their school hoodie. Please also ensure that your child is wearing warm socks - the plastic soles of many wellies do not insulate the children very well, and cold feet quickly become uncomfortable. Please make sure that your child has both wellies and trainers in school on Fridays, as if we do have to return, your child needs something to wear on their feet, other than wellies, in the classroom.
